

Welcome back to school after the Easter break! Below is an outline of the areas of study your child will be focussing on over the next term. This term we will be studying our new theme of 'Floresta Amazônica', linking most subjects to this theme.

Literacy

This term your child will be exploring different text forms including:
Stories, Diaries, Letters, Recounts, Debates and Non-Chronological reports.

Numeracy

Your child will be developing and improving their ability to confidently explore:
Fractions, Statistics, Area and Perimeter, Position and Direction.

Music

Improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the interrelated dimensions of music

Appreciate and understand a wide range of high-quality live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musicians

Develop an understanding of the history of music

Geography

Locational knowledge

Locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia) and North and South America, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries, and major cities

Place knowledge

Understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of a region of the United Kingdom, a region in a European country, and a region in North or South America

Geographical skills and fieldwork

Use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied

Floresta Amazônica

Design Technology

Prepare and cook a variety of predominantly savoury dishes using a range of cooking techniques.

Understand seasonality and know when and how a variety of ingredients are grown, reared, caught and processed.

Computing

Understand computer networks, including the internet; how they can provide multiple services, such as the World Wide Web, and the opportunities they offer for communication and collaboration

Use search technologies effectively, appreciate how results are selected and ranked, and be discerning in evaluating digital content

Use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact.

Homework: All homework can be found in the front of your child's book and is due every Wednesday.

Reading: Reading diaries are checked every Monday morning. Children must read 4 times in a week. The more reading the better 😊

Rainbow maths: Everyday your child will complete rainbow maths. The more practice at home the easier it is to move up! 😊
